THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERSOF PHILLIPS COUNTY, COLORADO AMENDMENT TO THE DECLARATION OF LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY RESOLUTION NO. 2020-03-20-04

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the worldwide outbreak of COVID-19 a "pandemic;" and on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a Federal Emergency Declaration for the coronavirus pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) Pandemic is causing widespread human and economic impacts to Phillips County, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 Pandemic is causing a public health emergency in Phillips County by generating multiple disruptions and impacts on healthcare infrastructure and continuity of Phillips County government that may cause delays or interrupt capacity to deliver necessary services; and

WHEREAS, the Phillips County Office of Emergency Management has advised the Board of County Commissioners of Phillips (Board) of a disaster (as the term is defined in the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act, § 24-33.5-701 et seq., C.R.S.) currently present in the area of Phillips County, to wit, the occurrence of imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from the COVID-19 Pandemic requiring emergency action to avert danger or damage; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate and in the interests of the public health and safety to rapidly address community spread of COVID-19 and subsequent cascading impacts such as economic distress, and would further protect the health and safety of the public, to declare an emergency in Phillips County; and

WHEREAS, the cost and magnitude of responding to and recovery from the impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic is far in excess of Phillips County's available resources; and

WHEREAS, the economic cost and magnitude of the State ordered closing of all restaurants, bars, gyms and theaters by Governor Jared Polis has greatly impacted the local economy; and

WHEREAS, declaration of a local disaster emergency will assist and permit access to local emergency funds, Federal and State assistance, adjustments to policies, procedures, and ordinances to ensure the public's health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, an Emergency Declaration allows Phillips County to be able to take proactive measures and activate our Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) to better respond to the impacts of the COVID-19 event; and

WHEREAS, the County has remotely activated its Emergency Operations Center, and the Board of County Commissioners now seeks to declare a local disaster, in addition to other steps outlined below, to address the COVID-19 outbreak; and

WHEREAS, as of Wednesday, March 18, 2020, Governor Polis has suspended normal in person instruction from March 23, 3030 to April 17, 2020 for all public and private elementary and secondary schools in Colorado, including public preschools on public school campuses; and

WHEREAS, the Phillips County Emergency Manager and Northeast Colorado Public Health Director have recommended that a local disaster be declared; and

WHEREAS, the Chair of the Board, as principal executive officer of Phillips County, is authorized to unilaterally declare a local disaster pursuant to§ 24-33.5-709, C.R.S., and to activate the emergency management and operations plans and resolutions of Phillips County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. There is hereby declared to be a local disaster emergency in the area of Phillips County, Colorado, to wit, the occurrence of imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property, resulting from the COVID-19 Pandemic requiring emergency action to avert danger or damage.

- The effect of this Declaration shall be to activate the response and recovery aspects of any and all applicable local and inter-jurisdictional disaster emergency plans and to authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance under such plans.
- Through vetting and an established training regimen, allow former Emergency 3. Medical Services staff that have previously been certified as an Emergency Medical Technician – Basic, Intermediate or Paramedic— to perform at those levels within agencies' written protocols.
